



LightSquared's Response to Representative Bachmann

LightSquared has NO intention of disrupting GPS. In June LightSquared moved to a new spectrum plan that would end interference for more than 99 percent of GPS devices. This week LightSquared unveiled a technical solution that we believe solves the interference issue for the small number of GPS devices that were not covered by the June plan. These technical solutions will be tested by government agencies – including the military – in coming months.

In addition, we would like to correct the record on the following issues:

- LightSquared does not plan ``to activate'' a network that will jam GPS. When testing revealed a problem with GPS, LightSquared moved to new spectrum and a new launch plan.
- The FCC waiver does not allow LightSquared to proceed; it blocks the company from moving forward until the GPS issue is solved.
- LightSquared does not know what was said in General William L. Shelton's classified briefing, and, if it did, would never try to make public what was said behind closed doors. However, some of General Shelton's comments that Representative Bachman attribute to the closed door briefing were made in an open hearing with the press and public in attendance.
- Mr. Phil Falcone is a registered Republican and two thirds of his political donations go to Republicans.
- Most of the decisions involving LightSquared were made during Republican administrations under Republican FCC Chairmen.

LightSquared is working very hard on these issues as it prepares to invest \$14 billion to build a new wireless network, bring new competition to consumers and create 15,000 jobs each year for the next five years.
